Our vision as a church is about one word - **EQUIP**

We believe Mission exists to equip people to **BECOME** Believers, **GROW** as Followers, and **RISE** as Leaders.

While that vision is simple, it has far reaching implications on how it is carried out.

What does it mean for someone to **BECOME a Believer**?

For someone to BECOME a believer, one has to make the conscious and intentional choice to trust in Jesus Christ as their Savior. However, for a person to get to the point of that decision, there is a process that has to take place. What kind of process? There are many people that haven't grown up with any real knowledge of who God is, who Jesus actually was, and what the Bible teaches. The process to BECOME a Believer is one of growing in knowledge of what sets Christianity apart and weighing that out against all the other philosophies and ideas of the world.

What does it mean for someone to **GROW as a Follower**?

Once a person trusts Christ as their Savior, a new life begins! With that new life comes the call and opportunity to grow in our walk with Christ. This growing process is intended for us to become more like Jesus in every way. Our life choices, our words, our attitudes, and our heart are all to reflect the presence of Christ and the will of God in our lives. We grow by spending time in the Bible, spending time in prayer, getting connected with a group of fellow believers, serving others through ministry, trusting the Lord with our finances and even sharing our faith with others around us.

What does it mean to **RISE as a Leader**?

Once a person becomes a believer, and takes the call to heart to grow as a follower, the Lord desires for that person to RISE into a place of leadership. We believe leadership isn't about a position or a title, it is about influence. Christ will open doors of opportunity for us to leverage our influence for the sake of His name.

The Lord will call people to serve in leadership positions, either paid or volunteer, however, He is more interested in someone leveraging their influence wherever they find themselves (Neighborhood, work, school, community, and church).

WHAT ARE WE DOING?

Our church is growing!

It is so exciting, week-in and week-out to see the number of new faces, returning faces, and those who get connected! In order to best meet the needs of our growing church our initiative will give us the ability to do the following:

- Add significant gathering, connecting, and fellowship space that will assist in first time guests being introduced to Mission Church. This will also allow for greater opportunities for people to hang out and converse together before or after a service especially on Sundays when the weather is less than ideal for outdoor conversation.
- An addition of new and larger bathrooms adjacent to the sanctuary that will be much easier to find and access.
- A new children's check-in/check-out area along with a more open corridor to and from the children's building. This will allow parents to drop off and pick up their children more efficiently.

WHY ARE WE DOING IT?

Simply put, we have needed these improvements for some time. As we have grown, especially over the last 6 months, the strain on our current entryway/lobby has only increased. The crowded entryway has made it difficult for people to talk, get information, and even pick up kids from the children's building.

WHY ARE WE DOING IT NOW?

A church that is not able to grow its facilities as the church grows will soon be a church that is not able to continue to grow! At some point we will reach our maximum ability to effectively connect with guests, connect with families, and foster opportunities for community. We do not want to miss critical connections with those who decide to visit Mission for the first time (or even a 2nd or 3rd). Additionally, we have delayed much needed repairs to the front of the sanctuary as long as we could!

PRIMARY GOAL

To see 100% engagement through the Connect Initiative.
That every person who calls Mission church their home will support,
to the best of their ability, the initiative over the next 2 years.

SECONDARY GOAL

To fully fund our ministry engagement budget

To fully fund the cost of the our much needed addition that will include:

- New restrooms adjacent to the current sanctuary
- Large open gathering and information space
- Central entry point into the church before entering worship
- Larger mom and baby room accommodating the growing number of young families
- New kitchen to better support church fellowship meals
- Large open space that can function for varying types of events and functions throughout the church (women's events, VBS, etc.)

**THE FINANCIAL GOAL FOR THIS INITIATIVE
IS \$3.5 MILLION DOLLARS!**

WHAT WILL THIS ENABLE US TO DO?

- Reach our secondary goal enabling our church to continue to fund all ministry initiatives for 2 years
- Reach our secondary goal to fully fund the cost of the building addition.

WHY ARE THESE GOALS **IMPORTANT**?

- We will not sacrifice our ability to fund ministries across Mission for the sake of “bricks and mortar”.
- Ability to complete our addition as soon as possible in order to not lose ground with the growing needs of our church and community.
- Your engagement and involvement are critical in us reaching these goals **TOGETHER**

WHAT IS GOD CALLING YOU TO DO?

KNOW THE MATERIAL

There will be a lot of materials provided, including this booklet, throughout the initiative. Being intentional to take the time to read through all materials and have a firm understanding of what we are doing and why we are doing it.

GET CONNECTED

From the initial vision events, Sunday worship services, small groups, advance commitment night, and through commitment Sunday. You being present as much as possible will put you in the best position to hear the voice of the Lord and how He will be leading you and your family to participate over the next 2 years.

PRAY

Prayer is not only a talking with and asking God for the things you want Him to do, but also a time to reflect and listen. Listen intently for His voice of guidance and leadership. Seek His guidance on what you should do over the course of the initiative.

TALK IT OVER

Talk with your family members, discuss what you are thinking, and why you are thinking it. You may be surprised by how other members of your family have very similar if not the same ideas! It can give the opportunity for the Lord to really show how He is working through your entire family!

DECIDE

As you participate, pray, discuss, and engage, what are you going to do? How are you going to be a participant in our 2 year initiative? After all we have walked through, it will be time to decide and act on that decision.

FAQ

WHAT ARE WE AIMING TO DO WITH THIS INITIATIVE?

New Bathrooms: From the vantage point of the guest, Mission's restrooms have always been hard to find. Study after study that tracks churches and their ability to retain first time guests lists bathrooms as one of the key factors in guests having a positive first experience and considering a return visit to a church.

Traffic flow to children's building: The biggest cause of poor traffic flow between the sanctuary and the children's building is a narrow hallway created by a mechanical closet housing the sanctuary HVAC system. This project would allow us to relocate that HVAC to the new build, widening the hallway and enabling two-way traffic flow between the spaces.

Gathering/Connecting Space: Our current coffee bar and lobby are too small to adequately serve first-time guests, provide church and event information, or offer space for people to gather—especially on rainy, cold, or hot Sundays. Clear, welcoming areas for information, connection, and questions are essential for helping guests feel at home and become long-term, committed members.

New Kitchen: Like other spaces at Mission, the current fellowship hall is undersized for our church. While the kitchen functions well, it lacks key commercial features needed to serve larger groups. Adding a kitchen to the new build will provide adequate space for food prep, cooking, and serving, while the new lobby will offer a more suitable fellowship area beyond Sunday mornings for gathering and sharing meals together.

Centralized Worship Entry: Currently, there are two main entrances to Mission's sanctuary. One allows people to enter directly from the parking lot, bypassing the coffee bar and guest information area. While greeters are present, there is limited space to provide adequate guest information. Meanwhile, the coffee bar and lobby become crowded before services as families access the children's building and others move to and from small groups, making the guest information table difficult to find and access—especially for first-time guests.

FAQ

WHY IS THIS SOMETHING THE CHURCH NEEDS TO DO NOW?

- We have “kicked the can” down the road on this project more than one time over the last few years.
- We have reached a point that even with the potential cost, we cannot continue to put off providing adequate space to receive guests and help attenders connect and take next steps.
- Mission’s internal spaces were built for a different era, while today’s ministry requires more open environments. If we delay this initiative, we risk losing valuable time in preparing to welcome families as thousands of new homes are completed nearby. Our current spaces already present challenges, and addressing them now will better position us to receive, connect with, and engage guests. In many cases, we have one meaningful opportunity when guests first arrive—and making the most of that moment depends on this initiative.

HOW MUCH WILL THIS PROJECT COST?

Based on current market conditions for commercial construction per square foot, plus a total resurfacing of the front parking lot and surfacing the back parking lot, the total cost will be **approximately \$2 million dollars**.

WHAT MIGHT HAPPEN IF WE DO NOT DO THIS INITIATIVE NOW?

Without moving forward with this initiative, logistical challenges will continue to hinder our ability to help people Become Believers, Grow as Followers, and Rise as Leaders. Ongoing traffic flow issues to the children’s building will frustrate families, and the lack of a centralized entry point will cause first-time guests to be missed. We are nearing a plateau in what we can effectively handle on a Sunday, and our ability to connect with people and share the Gospel will remain limited if these challenges are not addressed.

In the next several pages you will find needed tools to enhance your spiritual journey through the companion message series. This series is not only about the initiative, it is about creating a culture of generosity that will impact our lives, our community, and our church for years to come.



WEEK 1

THE CHARACTER OF **GENEROSITY**

BIG IDEA:

To understand what it means to be generous, we have to know where generosity originates.

KEY SCRIPTURES:

James 1:5, 4:6, 2 Corinthians 8:9

SUMMARY:

There are a lot of ways that one might describe God: Holy, Mighty, All Powerful, Creator, Lord . . .

There are many others, but for many, they don't normally think of God as generous. However, that is just one of many distinctive character traits that describe our God. God is generous in grace, generous in mercy, generous in giving wisdom, and generous in love. God has not withheld the best of who He is, and He even gave His best with no assurance that each and every human will love Him in return. This message explores what the Bible says about God's generous nature and understand why generosity is so important.

WEEK 1

NOTES:

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- *How do you think about generosity in light of exploring God's nature of generosity?*
- *How important is it to know God as a generous God?*
- *Does this change the way you see God or what God is like?*

PRAYER:

Dear Heavenly Father, thank you for being Adonai our generous loving God. Grant us your wisdom and grace as we humbly come asking you to help us be more like you and increase our generosity in all things. We know everything belongs to you, and we praise you for what you are doing in and through us Lord. In Jesus name we pray, Amen.

Practical Ideas for Living and Giving GENEROUSLY

Nearly every day, we make financial decisions. Some are small – should you get a cup of coffee at McDonald's or splurge for the Pumpkin Spice Latte at Starbucks? Some are big – which house, which car, which college? Some concern the future – how much should you spend on Christmas, which retirement funds should you choose?

Probably the most challenging decision we make with money is the decision to give. Giving creates tension. We wonder, “If I give this away, how will the gap be filled?” That’s why giving is such a big deal. Nothing invites God into our lives like giving. Giving is a tangible way we declare our trust in and commitment to God. Giving often paves the way for God to show up in our lives in a powerful way.

Giving is not just a financial decision - it's a deeply spiritual decision. We have put this Generosity Toolbox together to help you consider how God has blessed you and how the Spirit might invite you to trust the Lord during the CONNECT campaign. You'll find ideas that will help you pray and consider how God is leading you to participate.

The most effective path to generosity is a spiritual path where you set your heart on things above. Then, your financial priorities will naturally flow out of your spiritual priorities. People often describe this as “living a generous lifestyle.” It is always a temptation to give to God in such a way that it makes little impact on how you live. The challenge of living a generous lifestyle is to intentionally and prayerfully find ways to do just that – to let your giving touch your living!

King David declared,

“I will not give to God that which costs me nothing.”

(2 Samuel 24:24)

King David understood that the value of the gift presented to God is determined by its value to the giver. A gift that would touch the heart of God must first touch the life of the giver! This is the spirit of lifestyle generosity — “If it is for my God, my gift must have meaning and value to me.” Lifestyle generosity is a level of giving that affects you – your plans, your activities, your attitude and your approach to life. It means giving up something in one area so that you can give more of yourself in another.

WEEK 2

THE CHALLENGE OF GENEROSITY

BIG IDEA:

There is a spiritual challenge to being a generous Christian, knowing where that challenge originates will help is understanding how to navigate it.

KEY SCRIPTURES:

2 Corinthians 9:8-12, Isaiah 32:8

SUMMARY:

God is a generous God, yes, but what about His people? Not always! Someone who gives their life to Christ is going to have one struggle at the core of their life until they stand before God: The struggle of the flesh. The flesh wants what the flesh wants, that is to seek things for its own gain, for its own pleasure, and for its own needs. However, the Bible calls us to live according to the Spirit that now lives in us, not the flesh. While this struggle between the flesh and the Spirit effects every believer in different ways, one key aspect of the struggle is worth paying attention to . . .

The struggle of generosity. The flesh wants to horde, the flesh wants to hold on to you, the flesh wants to accumulate. The Spirit desires us to mimic the nature of God, so rather than hanging onto, we give away. The battle of the flesh and the Spirit will challenge all of us to look at how we approach being generous from the leadership of the Spirit rather than the flesh.

WEEK 2

NOTES:

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- How often can you recall reaching for your wallet only to stop yourself?
- After this message, are your thoughts on generosity coming more from the flesh or the Spirit?
- What other areas of your life might you now recognize as a spiritual challenge?

PRAYER:

Dear Lord, give us eyes to see and ears to hear what you would direct us to do with being more generous with all that you have blessed us. Challenge us Lord and enable us to be cheerful givers, blessed by you, so that in all things at all times, we will abound in every good work, for your kingdom come and your will be done. In Jesus name we pray, Amen.

GENEROSITY JOURNEY

An Initial Giver is someone who responds to God's Word by giving for the first time, choosing to trust God and the church with their gift. (2 Corinthians 8:7–15)

A Consistent Giver chooses to give regularly, practicing the discipline of generosity. Setting up a recurring gift is often a way to develop this habit. (2 Corinthians 9:6–8)


An Intentional Giver thoughtfully considers their giving in relation to other spending, making generosity a deliberate priority. (Luke 14:28–35)

A Sacrificial Giver recognizes the cost Christ paid on the cross and responds by surrendering 100% of their resources to honor God. Their giving changes them, reflecting that generosity governs their spending and saving—not the other way around. (Colossians 1:15–18, 22–23)

A Lifetime Giver thinks beyond month-to-month or year-to-year generosity, making short-term decisions with long-term impact. Their generosity is guided by a lifetime giving commitment that shapes major financial choices—such as homes, cars, and investments. (1 Timothy 6:6–19)

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF MAKING A COMMITMENT



THE CAUSE OF GENEROSITY

BIG IDEA:

One BIG reason Christians are called to be generous is about one word - response.

KEY SCRIPTURES:

Acts 2:46, Galatians 5:22

SUMMARY:

Now that we have a deeper understanding of the struggle of the flesh and the Spirit, especially when we talk about generosity, we now turn our attention to what causes us to be generous. What is the motivation behind being generous. To put it very simply – because God gave us everything in His Son. He humbled Himself and was clothed in flesh. He willingly went to the cross as an innocent man to shed His blood for the forgiveness of our sin.

We decide to Become Believers in Jesus, and follow Him as our Lord and Savior, we now have a response to that free and wonderful gift – being generous. Being generous flows out of a heart that is grateful for ALL God has done for me and given me through Christ. Since we are called to be “imitators of God”, the we imitate Him by being people who are marked by generosity.

WEEK 3

NOTES:

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- What do you think it looks like for you to live with a grateful heart?
- How much time do you think you give to praying and reflecting on all that God has done for you?
- What is one thing you can change in your life, right now, to reflect an attitude of gratefulness?

PRAYER:

Dear Lord, Elohim, Creator God of everything- We thank you and praise you for your free gift of salvation through Jesus Christ. We thank you for your Holy Spirit working in and through us, enabling us to bear your good fruit of love, joy, peace, long suffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self control. Lord grant us a generous spirit, grateful for your divine provision in our lives and in your church. In Jesus name we pray, Amen.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF MAKING A COMMITMENT

This campaign is an opportunity for us to understand the “why” of commitment cards in giver-centric language, instead of church-centric language. Emerging generations of Christians have less interest in the needs of the finance committee to form a budget for the church or the need “to keep the lights on and pay the salaries.”

- What if we all thought of a commitment card in terms of the spiritual check-up it could provide?
- What if we saw commitment cards as an opportunity not to be missed to reassess one’s gratitude to God?
- What if we saw commitment cards as a sign of trust for the future and the joy of joining God in the advance of the Kingdom?
- What if we saw commitment cards as a reminder of the life-giving, family strengthening and joy experience from being in a right relationship with God’s abundance entrusted to us?

A COMMITMENT CARD

- Requires a decision over delay; action over avoidance.
- Provides opportunity for personal (self) assessment.
- Motivates a specific increase in one's generosity.
- Communicates the importance of personal growth in giving (Most important decisions in life are confirmed by written docs.).
- Offers an occasion for a church-wide step of faith and commitment (a growth event).
- Provides financial information that enables leaders to make wise decisions.
- Enables church leaders to assess and measure the congregational generosity.
- The card, from day-one, represents the culmination of an important spiritual journey. As important as everything we do is, the card is all driving us to the completion of the card.
- Allows a point of conversation and decision for an individual and couple.
- Provides a timeline for decision personally and organizationally rather than an undefined closure.
- Physical symbols carry power. Like a wedding ring, they don't create the reality—they don't make someone married—but they symbolize commitment, matter to those involved, and communicate that commitment to others.
- A goal when written is much more likely achieved than one that remains in the head. A written commitment makes it real, and provides a mechanism for accountability.
- In an age when so many helpful but automatic giving options abound, it is tempting to put one's giving on autopilot. This can stall one's continuing growth and discipleship and impact in generosity. Completing a card allows for the automated giver to reassess their giving level.

WEEK 4

THE CALL OF **GENEROSITY**

BIG IDEA:

The call to be generous is a key foundation of the life of a believer. As hard as it is to accept, at times, it is not optional.

KEY SCRIPTURES:

Ephesians 4:28, 1 Timothy 6:8

SUMMARY:

Throughout the New Testament, there is a call that is given to Christ's church to be people of generosity. God is generous, so His people are generous.

The natural desire of the world to take for oneself and do for oneself without thinking of others. Generosity is giving and doing for others without thought of self. It counters the broken nature of the broken world we live in. Paul issued challenges to the churches he founded to be generous and those challenges were issued against a backdrop of limited incomes and high taxes. Kind of sounds familiar if we are to be totally honest.

As we understand that there is a call on a believer, and the church, to be generous, it will have a high influence on the decisions a person makes concerning their life and how generous they choose to live.

WEEK 4

NOTES:

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- What does it mean to you that you are called to be or do something? What is your understanding of the word calling?
- Have you ever thought about generosity being a calling or have you up to this point viewed generosity as optional?
- Does the idea of being called change your understanding of how Christ wants to be Lord of all areas of your life?

PRAYER:

Dear God, thank you for reminding us to not put our hope in wealth, which is so uncertain, but to hope in you, Lord, who richly provides for us in all things. In this way, we will lay up for ourselves treasure in heaven. Help us fight the good fight of the faith, do good, be rich in good deeds, and be generous and willing to share with anyone in need. In Jesus name we pray, Amen.

GIFT PROFILE **GUIDE**

What do we believe God is calling each of us to do as we are asked to participate in this campaign?

As you pray about what God is asking you to give during this time, consider how generosity plays a role in living a life of significance. Use this guide as a tool, allowing it to inspire and challenge you to commit more deeply to generous living.

Goal for Connect Initiative: \$3.5 Million

This is a chart showing commitment total amounts, and then breaking it up to show what that commitment would require annually, monthly, and weekly.

If God has led you to make a financial commitment to this project, we know it is helpful to see how your giving could be every week, month, and year. We've provided the following calculator to help you see it, but no one should feel confined to this schedule.

THE CONSEQUENCE OF GENEROSITY

BIG IDEA:

Generosity will have an impact, there will be positive consequences on a person, a family, and a church practicing generosity

KEY SCRIPTURES:

Acts 2:47, Proverbs 11:25

SUMMARY:

In Acts 2, we see a clear picture of how generosity shaped the early church—both in how believers responded to the Gospel and in how others responded to their example. Verses 44–47 tell us that the early believers “shared everything they had . . . sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need . . . worshiped together . . . met in homes for the Lord’s Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity—praising God and enjoying the goodwill of the people.” Their generosity created a culture of care, unity, and trust, and it drew others to Christ.

Generosity generates goodwill, softens hearts, and opens the door for the Gospel. The most profound consequence of generosity is salvation. Every time we choose to bless, invest in, and help others through our giving, we may have a direct impact on someone’s eternity. What a powerful reason to be generous!

WEEK 5

NOTES:

QUESTIONS TO CONSIDER:

- In light of Acts 2, how do you see the potential impact of your own generosity?
- How might the account of the early church in Acts 2 change the way you view helping and blessing others through generosity?
- In what ways are you more open to being more generous (Time? Talent? Relationships? Finances?)

PRAYER:

Dear Lord, thank you for who you are, the God who can do immeasurably more than all we can ever ask or imagine according to your power that is at work within us. Bless us, our family, and our church as we strive to become grow and rise as obedient followers of Jesus- to bring you, glory, honor, and praise! Thank you Lord for what you're doing and what you are going to do in our lives and in your church. In Jesus name we pray, Amen.



FINAL THOUGHTS

Let us all join together in praying throughout the entire CONNECT Initiative in the following ways:

- That this season in our church would be key in setting the stage for the next 5-10 years of ministry in our growing community.
- That we seek the Lord for spiritual focus and renewal
- That the Lord would use our initiative to see those that don't know Christ make decisions to Become Believers.
- That the period of time between when the initiative begins and when construction begins be smooth, that all barriers would be removed, that all permits would be secured without hindrance, and that the right contractor be identified.
- That the leaders of our church, and this initiative, be protected, and the Lord would continue to give them the energy needed to lead our church through this exciting time.
